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Course Syllabus

Course Description: This online text-based course is designed to assist psychologists in the provision of culturally competent, developmentally appropriate, and trans-affirmative psychological practice with Transgender and Nonconforming (TGNC) people. The course materials present the rationale and need for guidelines for working with TGNC people. The five categories and 16 guidelines developed by the APA Committee on Sexual Orientation and Gender Diversity (CSOGD) and APA Division 44 are then presented, discussed, and applied to professional practice. The course concludes with a comprehensive list of references and definitions.

Course Objectives (Learning Outcomes):

By successfully completing this course, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Discuss the rationale and goals for guidelines when working with Transgender and Nonconforming (TGNC) people
- 2. Identify and discuss the five categories and 16 guidelines identified by the American Psychological Association for working with TGNC clients

- 4. Identify and define important terminology related to the TGNC population

Audience and Course Level: This course is appropriate for Psychologists, Mental Health Counselors, Social Workers, and Marriage and Family Therapists. The Guidelines covered in this course are an introductory resource for psychologists who will encounter Transgender and Nonconforming (TGNC) people in their practice, but can also be useful for psychologists with expertise in this area of practice to improve the care already offered to TGNC people. The Guidelines include a set of definitions for readers who may be less familiar with language used when discussing gender identity and TGNC populations. The course level is considered introductory since it introduces the learner to the foundational guidelines for working with this population and no prerequisite training is required.

Course Utility and Potential Risks/Conflicts: The utility of this course lies in helping practitioners learn and apply the 16 guidelines developed by the American Psychological Association (APA) in working with Transgender and Gender Nonconforming (TGNC) people. The primary goal is to assist psychologists in the provision of culturally competent, developmentally appropriate, and trans-affirmative psychological practice with TGNC people.
